



Prem Plus Fixed Upgrade Fare on OpenSkies

British Airways is pleased to announce the introduction of new fixed price upgrade fares for travel on OpenSkies. These special fares are available now to book into Prem Plus (Premium Economy) whenever one of the lowest 6 booking classes (O, Q, N, S, V, L) are available, using an Eco (Economy) fare basis code.

FAQ's

What routes and which cabins?

NYC (JFK and/or EWR) to/from ORY – OpenSkies from Eco to Prem Plus.

What is the cost?

The fare is \$200 USD more than the corresponding economy class fare and is valid for round-trip itineraries.

What are the applicable booking classes?

The fares are available when O, Q, N, S, V and L are available, and use a fare basis code from the Eco cabin applicable to the corresponding booking class that they originate from. Please note, however, that even with an Eco fare basis code, this fare books into Prem Plus (T booking class).

What are selling and travel dates?

The fares are available for sale now and valid until further notice.

How do the fares work?

The fares in the Eco cabin apply when T is available and the corresponding class in M cabin is available. For example, the N trade up fare to T only applies when N and T are both available. When N is no longer available, the S trade up fare applies and so on. Tickets issued with these fares do not require a control or deal number.

How can I see the fares?

The fares will auto quote in your GDS. Sabre and Galileo users may complete the transaction without any special entries. Below are examples of suggested GDS fare display entries for Amadeus and Worldspan users. Please consult your GDS for further information.

Amadeus - FQDNYCPAR/D10SEP/R:U/CT

Worldspan - 4FNYCPAR15MARSR-BA#T

Can I quote and then ticket later?

Yes, but if the corresponding class in the Eco cabin is no longer available, re-quoting the itinerary is required. For example, if the T trade up fare is quoted when N was available, but N later becomes unavailable, a re-quoting of the fare is required. Customers should therefore be encouraged to take advantage of the fare immediately.
